

3. Homework Guidelines

Doing Homework and Stdying / Revising goes hand in hand but they are not interchangeable

"Motivation is what gets you started. Habit is what keeps you going." - Jim Ryun



Rationale of Homework

- 1. Follow-up of the lesson learnt
- 2. An assessment to test for understanding
- 3. A reinforcement of concepts and lessons taught and learnt
- 4. Preparation for a new lesson

Estimated Duration of Homework

Level	P4
Duration	1 hours to 1.5 hours

Homework: Parents' Support

- a. Set a specific place / time to do homework or do work (Routine)
- b. Check that your child completes the homework and hands it to the teacher on time
- c. Reinforce good study habits and learning attitude

Subject-Based Banding

- To recognise the different abilities of Pupils
 - Provide more flexibility in subject combinations for Pupils with strengths and abilities that vary across subjects

Subject Combination Guidelines

a. Readiness of the child to take the combination

a. Best Fit: Offer the Challenging Option

What SBB means for your child

Greater flexibility in subject combinations

 Your child has the choice to take a combination of standard and foundation subjects, depending on his strengths

What are the choices available?

If your child (for P4 Exam)	Your child may be recommended to take
Passes all 4 subjects and performs very well in MTL	 4 standard subjects + Higher Mother Tongue Language
Passes all 4 subjects	 4 standard subjects
Passes 3 subjects	4 standard subjects
Passes 2 subjects or less	 4 standard subjects; or 3 standard subjects + 1 other foundation subject; or 2 standard subjects + 2 other foundation subjects; or 1 standard subject + 3 other foundation subjects; or 4 foundation subjects

Note regarding offering HMT

HMT should be offered by pupils who are very good in their MT and are passionate about the subject.

 During PSLE posting exercise, the Higher Chinese grades could be used as one of the tie-breaker considerations, Only for application to <u>SAP</u> schools.

Note regarding offering HMT

- The school would offer 1H 4S if we have found the pupil suitable for this course
 - 85 marks and above for CL,TL or ML
 - must have scored well for MT Paper 1
 - at least 80 marks for Eng, Maths and Science
- Pupil offering 1H 4S must ensure that he/she is able to meet the demands of a rigorous curriculum
- Pupil will HAVE TO take HMT at PSLE
- Pupil will not be allowed to drop the subject halfway.

Note regarding offering HMT

- Following categories of students will have an opportunity to offer HMT in secondary school:
- Those who attained an overall PSLE score of 8 and below or
- Those who have attained PSLE score between 9 to 14 inclusive; and achieving
 - i) AL1 or AL2 for Standard Mother Tongue or
 - ii) Distinction or Merit for Higher Mother Tongue

How does Subject-Based Banding Work?

[At P4]

School recommends subject combination, based on P4 exam results. Parents indicate preferred combination.



[At P5]

Pupil takes subject combination chosen by parents

How does Subject-Based Banding Work?

[End of P5]

Pupil who takes standard subjects and has difficulty coping

All other Pupils

School may allow him to take 1 or more subjects at foundation level in P6

School will allow them to continue the same subject combination in P6



[At P6]

Pupil takes subject combination decided by school



[End of P6]

Pupil sits for Primary School Leaving Examination (PSLE)

Subject Recommendation

- a. Performance in P4 Examinations –
- b. Child's Consistent Performance in subject throughout the year
- Recommendation by teachers based on child's ability to cope with the subject

Subject-based Banding and Secondary School admission

- Progression to secondary level depends on PSLE Score
 - The students will undergo the revised PSLE scoring system
 - Different expectations of standard and foundation subjects will be taken into account when the PSLE score is calculated
- Offering weaker subjects at foundation level is not a disadvantage.
 - Your child will be able to focus on building up strong fundamentals in the weaker subjects

The New PSLE Scoring System

- Change from PSLE T-score to wider scoring bands aims to reduce overly-fine differentiation in examination scores and over-emphasis on academic results.
- It will also be more reflective of a pupil's level of achievement in relation to learning objectives of the curriculum and is not based on pupil's performance relative to that of his/her peer.

The New PSLE Scoring System

- Pupil's raw mark for each subject is converted into a scoring band called an Achievement Level (AL), with AL1 being the best score and AL8 being the lowest score.
- Pupil's who have been given approval for Exemption from Mother Tongue will be given an imputed (assigned) score between AL6 to AL8.
- The total of the ALs will be the PSLE SCORE (Between 4 to 32)

Secondary School Admission

- Depending on how well the pupil does at for PSLE, he will be posted to a course suitable for him:
 - a. Express
 - b. Normal (Academic)
 - c. Normal (Technical)
 - d. Re-taking P6 year

Direct School Admission

 Students may be admitted to selected secondary schools based on students' area/s of strengths and passion.

 Certain Secondary schools may have various criterion for admission to their schools. These criterions are based on that school's niche area and they are available in the respective schools' websites.

Home-school Partnership
